KPL Awarded National Grant for Small & Rural Libraries!

KPL has been selected as one of 300 libraries to participate in the fourth and final round of Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Communities, an American Library Association (ALA) initiative that provides community engagement and accessibility resources to small and rural libraries to help them better serve people with disabilities.

The competitive award comes with a \$10,000 grant that will help the library make our space more physically accessible to the community.

As part of the grant, KPL's staff will take a course in leading conversations, and then host a conversation with residents about physical accessibility at KPL, and then use grant funds to update our space accordingly.

This means we want to hear from **you** on how we can increase the accessibility of our facilities and services. Join us for a discussion about how our space works (and doesn't work) for you.
